A true credit to their tireless work and commitment. I would like to thank and make special mention of Nikki Robertson at the Liverpool Plains Visitor Information Centre for connecting me with Virginia Wood. Virginia, a local artist painted me a very special painting to recognise my 'sacred journey' back to country. This is a beautiful and thoughtful gift.
